REQUIREMENTS

The Building Safety Act 2022 (BSA) places an obligation on the Principal Accountable Person (PAP) to produce a resident engagement strategy.

The strategy must promote the participation of residents in the decision-making process about the building safety risks in the building.

Building safety risks are defined by the BSA as the risk of spread of fire or structural failure.

Contents of an Engagement Strategy

The strategy will need to contain:

- what information will be provided to residents
- what residents will be consulted on
- how residents' views will be sought
- how residents' views will be taken into account
- how the effectiveness of the strategy will be measured

Effectiveness may be measured in multiple ways, such as surveys, meeting attendance and feedback.

The strategy will need to be provided to all residents aged 16 years and over. They will need to be kept informed about the safety of the building, including the building safety risks. Residents will be able to request further information unless it contravenes data protection legislation.

Consideration must be given to the different types of information residents will need at different stages of their occupancy. For example, a new resident will need to understand their duties in their new place of residence.

The engagement strategy will need to be updated to include any new information and must be considered a live document and will need to be submitted with the safety case to the building safety regulator.

The PAP must consult the residents on the first residents engagement strategy and take their views into account. They are no required to change the strategy if they do not believe it is appropriate. The decision to incorporate changes or not following consultation must be recorded.

BUILDINGS IN SCOPE

The resident engagement strategy will be required for all buildings with two or more residential dwellings and are 18m or above, or that have seven storeys or more, whichever threshold is met first.
